

(4) For Faculty of Fine Arts: a portfolio or a music record

- The accepted exchange students will receive an Acceptance Letter from University of Ostrava (hard copy). The Acceptance Letter will be sent to the partner university.
- Students have to apply for a student visa (long-term study visa) at the nearest Czech embassy or consulate.
- Please note that the long-term visa process can take more than 2 months.

#### Insurance

# **ESTIMATED COSTS OF LIVING**

Below is an estimate of the cost of living in the Czech Republic per month. The actual cost can differ depending on the student's life style.

Please note that all costs below are subject to change without prior notice.

Housing	2 500 – 6 390 CZK	(120 - 300 USD)
Meals	6 200 CZK (285 USD)	Subsidized student meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) are available at the restaurants within the Jan Opletal Halls of Residence and Kampus Palace.
Transportation	300 – 800 CZK (14 - 37 USD)	ODIS card (public transport card) - a ticket valid for 1, 3 or 5 months uploaded to a public transport card; price depending on the kind of selected travel zone; for students up to 26 years old.
