The B.S. in History offers a unique opportunity to bridge the liberal arts and the sciences, reimagining such STEM fields as computer science, medicine, land management, and others by placing them within a humanistic context grounded in the liberal arts' traditions and methods. Students fluent in both the historian's language of communication, cultural context, empathy, and diversity, and STEM's emphasis on quantitative analysis and scientific methodology are well positioned to tackle the 21<sup>st</sup> century's most pressing problems. This degree envisions its graduates pursuing careers in information systems, digital humanities, parks and land management, historical preservation and curation, and more scientifically oriented segments of the law, such as environmental law.
