Celebrating 30 Years!

30 Years of Alumni and Student Recognition

Not many events last for 30 years but time hasn't stopped the Family and Consumer Sciences Department from celebrating Alumni and Students for their hard work and dedication to the FACS profession. Following is a brief history from Dr. Mary Harlan, former FACS Department Chair.

The first celebration was held in April 1988 with three main goals: (1) to honor departmental alums and supporters that served on the departmental Advisory Committee, (2) announce and develop scholarship funds, and (3) to welcome/introduce the new UCA President.

At the first annual celebration, the Advisory Committee recognized the first individuals to be named FACS Distinguished Alumni which included: Emily Oates of Morrilton, Cecily Coffelt-Bullard of St. Louis and Connie Westbrook of Conway. Additionally, Senator Stanley Russ of Conway was announced as the first recipient of the Distinguished Service/Friends Award.

Dr. Winfred Thompson had recently been selected as the seventh President of UCA and served as the keynote speaker for the *first* FACS Alumni celebration.

In addition to honoring distinguished FACS Alumni and Friends, a major goal for the FACS Alumni Committee was to establish scholarship funds to honor outstanding FACS students. Since 1988, 16 scholarship funds have been established and over \$320,000 has been awarded in FACS scholarships.

Since 1988, there have been 48 individuals introduced as departmental Distinguished Alums and 39 Young Achiever Award winners. For a list of recipients, please see the last page of the newsletter.
