## Didactic Program in Dietetics (DPD)

Accredited by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) by the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, the didactic program in dietetics at the University of Central Arkansas meets competencies for eligibility to apply to a dietetic internship. Successful completion of the dietetic internship is required to take the CDR Registration Exam to become a registered dietitian (RD).

- Business and Industry
- Community/Public Health
- Foodservice
- Research
- Education

# Dietetic Technician Registered (DTR) Exam

A DTR is an individual trained in food and nutrition and is an integral part of the health-care and foodservice management teams. Individuals who have completed the Bachelor of Science Degree and/or have a Verification Statement from a DPD program are eligible to take the DTR exam.

Many work environments require that an individual be credentialed as a DTR.





## Admission to Bachelor of Science in Dietetics

Students will apply to the DPD program in the semester in which they will complete 60 hours. Criteria includes: a "B" or better in NUTR 1300, NUTR 2311, NUTR 3310, BIOL 3406, BIOL 3407, and CHEM 2450.

Students will complete an online application and interview with the DPD director as part of this process.

- Food Science
- Medical Nutrition Therapy
- Nutrition Counseling
- Life Cycle Nutrition
