Dates & Estimated Cost

- October 25: Scholarship Applications close
- November: Students notified of Scholarship awards
- November 14-18: International Education Week
- December 15: Deposit due for students receiving Study Abroad Scholarships
- February 3: Application and Deposit Deadlines
- February 3: Available spots opened to Community Members and Alumni
- March: Mandatory Health and Safety Meeting for Study Abroad
- April: Mandatory Individual Meetings about health concerns or learning needs accommodations
- April: Mandatory Orientation with Faculty Leaders and other Students
- ♦ Travel Dates: May 10 June 1, 2023

- Student program fee (round trip airfare, AIFS orientation, accommodations, excursions, language classes, transportation, tickets, international medical insurance):
 \$3625 based on enrollment
- Study abroad fee: \$75.00
- Estimated additional costs (meals, optional excursions, personal expenses, souvenirs): \$1200 but varies by person
- ♦ UCA Study Abroad Tuition: A minimum of 3 hours is required. Tuition for study abroad is \$780 for 3 hours or \$1,560 for 6 hours.
- ♦ ESTIMATED TOTAL: \$5680
