#### Notes:

1. Students must complete a three-hour foreign language course at the 2000-level or above. This course is in addition to the foreign language requirement for a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree, which also requires completion of a three-hour foreign language course at the 2000-level or above.

2. The foreign language requirement in the International Studies major may be waived for students double-majoring or minoring in a foreign language. If waived, students are required to complete 21 credit hours in a concentration, instead of 18 credit hours.

## **Concentration Requirements (18 credit hours)**

Students must complete a minimum of eighteen [18] credit hours of upper-division elective courses within one of the following concentrations, including at least six [6] credit hours from the political science course offerings. An elective in the UCA Lower-Division Core (American History and Government), PSCI 1330 U.S. Government & Politics is a prerequisite for all upper-division political science courses. All upper-division political science courses have one additional prerequisite course - PSCI 2300 or PSCI 2320 - which are part of the Core Requirements for the International Studies major. Students are encouraged to complete PSCI 1330, 2300, and 2320 by the end of their second year at UCA. Several of the upper-division elective courses in the concentration satisfy the UCA Upper-Division [UD] Core requirements. Each of these courses is indicated below, along with the specific area(s) of the UCA UD Core: Effective Communication [C], Diversity [D], Critical Inquiry [I], Responsible Living [R], and Capstone [Z].
