Minor in Public Administration Checklist

Students may choose to minor in Public Administration (24 credit hours). Students minoring in Public Administration are required to complete 15 credit hours of core required PSCI and PADM courses, six credit hours at the 3000 level or above from the Public and Non-Profit Management issue area, and three credit hours at the 3000 level or above from the Policy Analysis and Advocacy issue area.
Note: 1. PSCI 1330, U.S. Government and Politics [ACTS: PLSC2003], is a prerequisite for all upper-division PSCI and PADM courses. PADM 2310, Introduction to Public Administration and Policy, is a prerequisite for all upper-division PADM courses.

* Political Science majors who wish to minor in public administration must use PADM 2310 for their major in political science. Therefore, political science majors must take an additional course from the public and non-profit management issue area <u>or</u> the policy analysis and advocacy issue area to meet the 24-credit hour minor requirement.
