

Bachelor of Science (B.S.) in Political Science Degree Program Checklist

_____ **Major in Political Science (42 credit hours)** – Students majoring in Political Science must complete a total of forty-two [42] credit hours, including the Core Requirements (15 credit hours), Experiential Learning Requirement (3 credit hours), and Subfield Requirements (24 credit hours). See checklist for the major in Political Science on the next page.

_____ **Minor or Additional Elective Courses** – Students majoring in Political Science may choose to complete a minor in another academic program or work with political science faculty to choose elective courses, including courses in other academic programs, to meet their career interests and to fulfill the university's 120-credit hour requirement.

_____ **UCA Lower-Division Core Requirement (38 credit hours)** – All students must complete the UCA Lower-Division (LD) Core. The UCA LD Core requires 38 credit hours at the lower division (1000- and 2000-level courses). These courses include the 35-credit hour required state minimum core and one additional three credit hour course to satisfy the responsible living element in the UCA Core mission. The remaining 35 hours from the state minimum are distributed in the other knowledge and skills areas of critical inquiry, effective communication, and diversity. _____ **UCA Upper-Division Core Requirement** – All students must complete the UCA Upper-Division (UD) Core using major, minor, and other elective courses. In order to satisfy this requirement, students must complete upper-division courses that address outcomes in each of the four areas of the UCA Core: Diversity [D], Critical Inquiry [I], Effective Communication [C], and Responsible Living [R]. In addition, all students must take a course designated as a Capstone Experience (Z). One course may satisfy up to two UD Core requirements, except for the Capstone Experience (Z). _____ **Total Credit Hour Requirement (120 credit hours)** – All students must complete at least 120 credit hours, and at least 40 credit hours must be upper-division courses at the 3000- and 4000-levels. For some students, this will mean that additional elective courses (lower-division and upper-division) will be required to meet the minimum 120 credit hours and 40 upper-division credit hours. A grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher is required in both the major and the minor programs, and an overall (cumulative) GPA of 2.0 or higher is also required. All course work attempted in the major and the minor will be included in determining the major and minor GPAs.

Subfield Requirements (24 credit hours) – Students must complete twenty-four [24] credit hours of upper-division elective courses, including at least one course (3 credit hours) from each of the five interdisciplinary subfields. In addition, a minimum of 18 of the 24 credit hours should be political science (PSCI) and public administration (PADM) courses. All of the upper-division political science courses in the subfields have prerequisites (e.g. PSCI 1330 is a prerequisite for all upper-division American Government & Politics courses and PSCI 2300 is a prerequisite for all upper-division International Relations courses). Descriptions of courses offered by the Department of Political Science and other departments, including the course prerequisites, can be found in the UCA Undergraduate Bulletin at <https://uca.edu/ubulletin/>. Several of the upper-division elective courses in the subfields, both political science and non-political science, satisfy the UCA Upper-Division Core requirements, which consist of upper-division elective courses in five different areas – Effective Communication [C], Diversity [D], Critical Inquiry [I], Responsible Living [R], and Capstone [Z].
