UCA Department of Government, Public Service, and International Studies

The UCA Department of Political Science was officially renamed the Department of Government, Public Service, and International Studies in Fall 2023! A reception was held in Buffalo Alumni Hall on September 12, 2023 to officially launch the department's new name, to present the 2023 Distinguished Alumnus Award, and to announce two new student-focused programs. Dr. Mark Mullenbach announced the establishment of the Student Experiential Learning Fund (SELF), which will provide small grants to departmental students who are participating in experiential learning activities outside of the classroom, including internships, service learning, academic conferences & seminars, and study abroad. In addition, Dr. Mary Beth Sullivan announced the establishment of an online academic journal for undergraduate research in political science, public administration, international studies, and related areas. Dr. Hyo-Won Shin, Assistant Professor, was introduced as the department's newest faculty member. The Department of Political Science hosted the 50th annual meeting of the Arkansas Political Science Association (ArkPSA) at UCA on March 3-4, 2023. Dr. Heather Yates and Dr. Mary Beth Sullivan served as co-program chairs for the annual meeting. Faculty, graduate student, and undergraduate student paper panels and roundtable discussions were held in the College of Business building on Friday afternoon and Saturday morning. The annual meeting dinner was held at the Hilton Garden Inn in Conway on Friday evening. Dr. John Passe-Smith, a faculty member in the UCA Department of Political Science, and Dr. Andrew Dowdle, a faculty member in the Department of Political Science at the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville), were presented the Association's Distinguished Scholar awards. Dr. Sara Wallace Goodman, Chancellor's Fellow and Dean's Professor of Political Science at the University of California, Irvine, gave the keynote speech during the dinner. The annual meeting luncheon was held in McCastlain Hall Ballroom at noon on Saturday. The featured speaker during the luncheon was Mr. Ben Hovland, a UCA alumnus and a member of the Election Assistance Commission (EAC) in Washington DC.

Department hosts Arkansas High School Model Arab League conference at UCA



The Department of Political Science and the UCA Model United Nations (MUN) student organization hosted the Arkansas High School Model Arab League (AHSMAL) Conference in the UCA Student Center on March 10-11, 2023. The conference was sponsored by the National Council on U.S.-Arab Relations (NCUSAR) in Washington DC. The AHSMAL conference, originally known as the South Central States Model Arab League (SCSMAL) conference, was previously held at the University of Arkansas-Fayetteville from 1996 to 2010 and the University of Arkansas-Little Rock from 2011 to 2020. More than 150 students from ten high schools, representing the 22 member-states and several observer states of the League of Arab States, participated in the conference. UCA graduate, **Sarah Fulmer**, served as Secretary-General for the Conference. UCA student, **Gabriel Mince**, served as Assistant Secretary-General, and UCA student, **Julien Mrad**, served as chair of the Council on Social Affairs. Department presents 2023 Distinguished Alumnus Award



Dr. Clay Arnold presented the department's 2023 Distinguished Alumnus Award to Justice Cody Hiland of the Arkansas State Supreme Court. Justice Hiland, who graduated from UCA with a bachelor's degree in public administration in 1993, previously served as U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Arkansas from 2017 to 2020. In July 2023, Justice Cody Hiland was appointed to fill a vacancy on the Arkansas Supreme Court by Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders. He graciously accepted the award and spoke of the life-long drive that the values of public service has given his career. He remarked that "public service has a nice ring to it, doesn't it? And inherent in the idea of public service is the idea that we're helping other people. I don't know if there's a greater calling in life than serving our fellow man." Read More

Alumnus Mouaz Moustafa honored with a James W. Foley Freedom Award



Mouaz Moustafa, who graduated from UCA with a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree in International Studies in May 2008, was honored with a James W. Foley Freedom Award (humanitarian award) presented during a ceremony held at the National Press Club in Washington, DC on May 3, 2023. Since 2011, Mouaz has served as Executive Director of the Syrian Emergency Task Force (SETF), which is a non-governmental organization dedicated to advocating for and providing humanitarian assistance to innocent civilians impacted by the civil war in Syria. The SETF also seeks accountability for war crimes committed by the Syrian government. The James W. Foley Freedom Awards are sponsored by the James W. Foley Legacy Foundation. In August 2024, James W. Foley, a freelance video journalist, was killed in the Raqqa region of Syria by terrorists affiliated with the Islamic State in Iraq and Syria (ISIS). Following his death, the foundation was established by James Foley's parents in Portsmouth, New Hampshire. Read More

Faculty News

Dr. John Passe-Smith, who taught comparative politics courses at UCA for 30 years, retired in May 2023. During his three decades at UCA, Dr. Passe-Smith co-edited several editions of the book Development and Underdevelopment: The Political Economy of Global Inequality. Dr. Passe-Smith was presented the Distinguished Scholar award during the 50th annual meeting of the Arkansas Political Science Association held at UCA in March 2023. Dr. Passe-Smith and Mary Sue Passe-Smith retired to their home in Tucson, Arizona.

Dr. Hyo-Won Shin, who graduated with a Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Illinois, was hired as Dr. Passe-Smith's replacement for Fall 2023. Dr. Shin specializes in comparative political behavior, Southeast Asian politics, and ethnic politics.

Dr. Joe Howard, **Dr. Kim Hoffman**, and **Dr. Kisha Hardwick** attended the Southeastern Conference for Public Administration (SECoPA) in Atlanta where they presented a paper entitled, "Public Service as a Profession: Encouraging Undergraduates to Pursue Public Service Careers" on September 28, 2023.

Dr. Heather Yates, Associate professor, received a book contract with Palgrave Publishing for her forthcoming book The Politics of Emotions and Uncertainty in the 2020 Presidential Campaign. This will be her 3rd solo-authored book on the subject of how emotions influence voters' and their choices. In addition, Dr. Yates received a research stipend in the summer of 2023 to support archival research at the Truman Presidential Library in Independence, Missouri, on a research project titled "Cloak & Dagger: Harry Truman and the influence of unchecked power networks inside the executive.

Dr. Clay Arnold published "Machiavelli's Deceptions" in the Summer 2023 issue of History of Political Thought. In it he reconstructs Machiavelli's concept of political deception as found in his most political works, The Prince, Discourses on Livy, and Florentine Histories. Contrary to popular opinion, Machiavelli's focus was far more on how not to become a victim of deception than a more adept practitioner of it.

Department of Government, Public Service, and International Studies (GPI) Fund — The GPI Fund broadly supports the department's academic programs, faculty, and students. The GPI Fund covers expenses that are not able to be covered by the department's maintenance and operation (M&O) account, including classroom upgrades, computers, and other technology. The GPI also covers expenses related to periodic academic program evaluations, including stipends for external reviewers.

Student Experiential Learning Fund (SELF) - The SELF fund provides small grants to students in the Department of Government, Public Service, and International Studies who are participating in experiential learning activities outside of the traditional classroom, including professional internships, service-learning, independent research, academic conferences & seminars, and study abroad. Students majoring in political science, public administration, and international studies at UCA are eligible to apply for a SELF grant to cover some of the costs associated with participating in an experiential learning activity.

Simms McClintock (AMUN) Fund – The AMUN Fund, which was established in honor of the founder of the Arkansas Model United Nations (AMUN) program, supports the ongoing AMUN program and the UCA students who participate in Model UN activities at UCA. Professor Simms McClintock, a former faculty member in the Department of Political Science, coordinated the AMUN program from 1966 to 1996, including organizing the annual AMUN Conference for thousands of high school students at UCA during this period. The AMUN Fund covers expenses associated with hosting the annual AMUN Conference and expenses associated with UCA student participation in collegiate Model UN conferences.

Mayor Tab Townsell Scholarship for Public Service – This scholarship, which was established in honor of former Conway Mayor Tab Townsell, provides scholarships for UCA students majoring in political science or public administration. Tab Townsell graduated with a Bachelor of Science (BS) degree in political science from UCA in 1984 and a master's in business administration (MBA) degree from Texas Christian University in 1986. Tab Townsell served as mayor of Conway from 1999 to 2016.
