# Point-In-Time Data Analysis 2019


On January 22, 2019, various organizations and volunteers around Faulkner County conducted the Point-in-Time Homeless Count in compliance with the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. This census aims at providing individuals and nonprofit organizations with a more holistic understanding of the homeless population in our community. We hope that these graphics will provide community members with a deeper understanding of how to best serve those in need living in Faulkner County.

We collected 191 survey responses total, however of those 20 were from repeated individuals. We also received data from the school districts in Faulkner, Conway, and Perry counties regarding their homeless students. In Faulkner County there are 35 sheltered, 42 unsheltered, 6 in hotel/motel, and 504 doubled up students—i.e., students living in a dwelling with double the capacity of residents it is designed and intended to house. In Conway County there are 15 sheltered, 3 unsheltered, 228 doubled up students. In Perry County there are 24 students living doubled up.

From the data collected, we can note that Faulkner County's homeless population consists primarily of straight, white, elderly individuals. While the survey form age range had 25+ as the oldest category, our homeless population tends to be older than 45 on average. With this in mind, one can see that Faulkner County as a whole could benefit from services geared towards an older population.

Looking towards the future, we would like to highlight a few issues of concern in the way that data is collected so that the Point-in-Time Homeless Count in 2020 would be able to provide community members with even more accurate data. The first issue we encountered is the question regarding total time homeless (numbers 9 & 10 on the PIT form). We found that many individuals reported contradictory information and that the wording of the questions made it difficult to understand and answer. Secondly, we found that many did not answer the surveys fully, thus making it difficult to have a more representative understanding of our homeless population. We hope these observations can be used to better equip those collecting and assisting with the PIT surveys in order to better meet the needs of those in our community who are experiencing homelessness.














#### **National Averages for Adult Resting Place**




