

Guidelines for Supervision of Students – Medicare Part A, Medicare Part B, and Medicaid

**Information in this document is based on references provided (see links) and does not constitute legal advice. The supervising therapist is responsible for following the requirements of third-party payors. Information is provided to help clinical instructors in planning for student experiences.

Students should receive direct supervision from the supervising physical therapist throughout each clinical experience. Requirements for supervision include:

- PT on site
- Direct supervision: supervising PT readily available
- The supervising PT will determine required proximity based on the following elements:
 - o State law
 - o Patient acuity/needs
 - o Third party payor requirements
 - o Clinical judgement regarding student ability
 - Facility policies
 - DPT program policies.

Information is based on information listed on CMS and Arkansas DHS websites accessed 10/10/24 and may be subject to change. Clinical instructors are responsible for providing services for patients with Medicare and Medicaid in compliance with state and federal guidelines so should review requirements periodically.

(A student may, of course, also sign but it is not necessary since the Part B payment is for the clinician's service, not for the student's services)."²
All settings	Medicaid (Arkansas)	 "Occupational therapy, physical therapy, and speech-language pathology services carried out by an unlicensed student may be covered only when a licensed provider of the service is present and engaged in student oversight during the entirety of the encounter, such that the licensed provider is considered to be providing the service."³
