



**University Scholarship Policy  
Scholarship Eligibility Based on Citizenship formerly  
Non-Resident Alien Scholarship Eligibility Policy**

To be eligible for university academic scholarships, a student must be classified as either a:

- 1) United States citizen,
- 2) Permanent resident of the United States,
- 3) Refugee, or
- 4) Asylum Grantee.

International students who do not hold any of the above classifications are eligible to apply for and be awarded scholarships through the Office of International Engagement, as well as through a variety of additional scholarships generally defined in the General Statement and listed on the Scholarship Designation Listing. Requirements may differ for each type of scholarship and it is the student's responsibility to review those requirements to determine if they qualify to apply.

Undocumented students (including Deferred Action on Childhood Arrival ["DACA"] students and Development, Relief, and Education for Alien Minors ["DREAMERS"]) are not eligible to apply for or be awarded university scholarships until such time as the student's citizenship status changes to one of the aforementioned classifications.
