VIII. Constituent Concerns

A. Cafeteria Parking

Per Chief: They park close so they can leave if we have an emergency. I will ask to see if they can eat a little earlier so they are gone before eight. I don't think they go to the civic meeting.

I've also observed on multiple occasions that UCAPD vehicles enter the cafeteria parking lot in the wrong direction to drive to the PD building rather than continue to follow the street to the stop sign and around the corner.

Per Chief: I will forward this to the patrol Captain.

B. Student Center ATMs

- With the current remodel / reorg happening in the SC, the ATMs were moved out of their nook and into an open space. There is now zero privacy
 - a) Per Colin Stanton, "That is the new permanent home for the ATM's. The space across the hall is about to undergo renovations to accommodate offices for the radio station.

On a side note, we're lucky to have the ATM's we have. Most of the banks that were here have chosen not to renew their lease with us. Those two are the only ones we'll have going forward.

If people are concerned about their safety using those ATMs in a more open area, let me add that security cameras cover those areas on the main hallway and it is a very public, high traffic area. That is the location that the banks chose after looking at all of their options for other locations in the building."
