- A. Committees on Committees

VII. Constituent Concerns/Communication

- A. Constituent Concern: "Has the idea of a daycare program (outside of the student study center) for faculty, staff, and students kids ever been considered? It seems like it would be such an amazing resource for so many people on campus. Especially if it was made affordable, I think it would help retain employees."
 - 1. **Response from Staff Senate President Jenny Ruud:** "As I suspected this idea has been heavily researched in previous years. Due to many issues (liability issues, state licensure requirements, cost to the university daily operation etc. and many other issues) it has not been considered to proceed. We do operate the UCA Child Study Center, but part of that function is to provide training for our students obtaining education degrees. Hope this helps!"
- B. Constituent Concern: A constituent mentioned the UCA Athletes Diversity Statement being stated or posted during a game they attended and they found that encouraging. They wondered if a similar statement or communication could come out from other departments, particularly Campus Recreation intramurals due to their awareness of racial tensions or language considered slurs during those sports brought to their attention. This is the statement I located that is what they were referencing: UCA Athletics Diversity, Belonging, Inclusion, and Equity Statement At the University of Central Arkansas, the athletics mission is to support all of our student-athletes, coaches and supporters to garner their best experience possible. This begins with our commitment to diversity, belonging, inclusion, and equity within our department, on campus and the community we serve. We recognize that these principles are essential not only for social responsibility but also to maintain our competitive advantage. We respect the diversity of thought and cherish those perspectives. We will attract and hire a diverse group of talented people to help us achieve our vision. We will embrace the similarities and differences in everyone fostering a culture of inclusive excellence by cultivating an environment where everyone is valued, respected, and heard. Our goal is to foster an environment of diverse thoughts and ideas where everyone feels included, respected, and appreciated.
 - 1. Response from Senator Richard Hammond, Director of Campus Recreation & Wellness: Campus Recreation and Wellness has a sportsmanship statement for intramurals that is distributed to the captains of the team. It is the expectation that team captains review the sportsmanship statements with their teams. Richard Hammond will look into the statement to review the language present. Due to multiple intramural games being played during the same time with teams constantly coming in and out, there would be a need for an intercom system on the intramural grounds to make the announcements at the start of each game. Teams also receive sportsmanship points. Inappropriate behavior could result in teams losing points and/or individuals being ejected. There are measures in place to handle inappropriate behavior. If someone does experience racial tensions, slurs, or inappropriate behavior, the incident will be reported to the Dean of Students office. Incidents are reported as individual, Greek, and other registered student organization code of

conduct violations. Based on the severity, individuals and groups who participate in inappropriate behavior are subject to suspension from intramural events and sanctions determined by the Dean of Students office if found responsible.

2. Response from Senators Jessica Taylor & Natalie Shock: The statement the constituent referred to was posted/read during the diversity and inclusion night. This was a special occurrence. The statement is on the athletics website, but it is not read at every game. The diversity statement is specific to athletes and may not necessarily fit the needs of the intramural games. Athletics typically has a sportsmanship statement for every game. The sportsmanship statement actually is one from the ASUN conference that is announced at every conference game as a conference requirement. Athletics chooses to announce the statement at all games.
