I. Call to Order

A. President Ables called the meeting to order at 10:00am.

II. Approval of the Minutes of previous meeting

A. 7/10/24 and 7/31/24 minutes were approved and posted on the Staff Senate website.

III. Guest Speaker: Debbie Brigham - Admin Support Coaching Circle

- **A.** Started about a year ago in HR, working closely with Charlotte Strickland on this idea. Michelle Kepke joined as co-presenter. New program to pull together information and wanted to add funds to provide food, etc.
- **B.** It will support the admin support staff at the university. It was presented that something was needed where we could pull all of our admin support staff to come together as a team. It is brand new and will meet on Wednesday's, once a month and starts in September.
 - 1. Initially meetings were going to be all Zoom meetings, but we wanted to build camaraderie and do some things face to face. Will meet in the Student Center in September and then go into zoom calls.
 - 2. Zoom calls will mostly be training and development. When they sign up, if they need extra help in a certain area (i.e Microsoft Word or Excel).
- C. We will focus on adding support and value to the admin staff and future admin who come onboard through a mentoring program. Allow them to get to know and not be in their silos. Some staff are a part of smaller departments and may be by themselves. There will be discussions to talk about challenges, ideas, training opportunities, and mentorship.
 - 1. Possible meeting segments (not all segments will be covered each meeting).
 - a) Did You Know segment- learning about things happening in each department/announcements

- b) Mentor program- take volunteers (UCA employed for a number of years) to become mentors to newly hired admins to take them under their wing. Will be continuous follow-up and reaching out.
- c) Development- training
- d) Volunteer opportunities- volunteering within the community
- e) HAVE FUN!- doing icebreakers, lunches, holiday fun
- f) Feedback- at the end of each meeting, they will be able to provide feedback on what they need and brainstorm how to provide assistance and understanding challenges
- **D.** The goal is to create a culture where everyone is capable and confident. There will be an introduction email sent to those interested and it will be posted in Inform to detail meeting dates.
- E. We don't have a budget/funds. Pulled a couple of menu ideas/items from Aramark. Previous admin luncheon had about 60 attendees and was a lot of fun. We don't plan to do a luncheon, but used the number to estimate for future events. There will be eight sessions with four being in person. Would like to do something like donuts, coffee, etc for those in-person sessions
 - 1. Asking for \$150/session which totals \$600 for the full year of in-person sessions.

- 1. Pres. Ables- You mentioned several guest speakers, do you know who you would like to come speak? Staff Senate would be interested in guest speaking.
 - a) D. Brigham- that sounds like a great idea and adding Be Well. We would love that to give information. Not everything is hammered down. September will be more of a get to know each other; October will be the Canva training
- 2. Senator Fulton- I'm classified as Admin 2 in addition to other titles at the library, do I still qualify for this group?
 - a) M. Kepke- you could be a project coordinator, an analyst—- we just want to pull everyone together because that is a challenge with the titles. Yes, of course you could be a part of the group. Targeting support staff
- 3. Senator Lugo- You said it would be on Inform, but if we know somebody, where can we point them?
 - a) D. Brigham- we will use our email list to start sending invites and they can sign up to develop our working email database.

VII. Constituent Concerns/Communication

- A. Update on Previous Constituent Concern: I am new to the Staff Senate and not sure if this is the proper way to inform everyone about this concern. I work in the Finance and Administration Department in McCastlain Hall in the basement. We have a water fountain right outside our offices. However, no one is able to or will use it due to the dark green water that comes out of it. We asked for maintenance/Conway Corp to take a look at it for us. But we were told that it is just from the pipes and if we hold down the button and let the water run it will clear up. Most of the workers down here carry refillable water bottles/cups everyday and we have to go to Wingo or the student Center to refill our bottles. We simply do not trust drinking from any of the fountains in our building due to this dark green water. I was asked to bring this to the attention of the Staff Senate and hope we can get some kind of a resolution.
 - 1. Response from Kevin Carter: Sorry for the late reply! I was out last week and have been playing catch-up for a few days. Conway Corp tested the chlorine level and the water and found it to be in the acceptable regulated range. Conway Corp believes that due to the low occupancy and low use of McCastlain during the summer, the water has become stagnant and lines need to be flushed. We did not advise anyone to hold the button down until it cleared up. Our plumbers flushed all of the lines that would have taken care of the issue if it was in fact what Conway Corp described. It sounds like it is still problematic, so I have asked Adam Hensley our EHS manager to contact a company called Environmental Enterprise Group so they can take water samples for lab testing. Once we have the results back, we can share the results with the building occupants and work on addressing any issues we find. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any additional questions.

Once a report is submitted, the reporter will be guided through the process by a Dean of Students staff member. Types of anonymous reports may include but are not limited to; hazing, uncharacteristic or extreme aggression towards others, suicide ideation, or major life events (family deaths, change in financial status, or less of a relationship). If you are not sure if your submission qualifies for 313-TALKUCA, submit your report anyway. The Dean of Students Office will make a determination about next steps for your report.
