I. Call to Order

II. Approval of the Minutes of previous meeting

VII. Constituent Concerns/Communication

A. Constituent Concern: "Hi y'all. A couple of days ago I learned that some Admin. Specialists were given a compression pay raise for the new fiscal year. This came as a complete surprise to me, since I didn't know this was even possible. I did reach out to Human Resources, and [a representative] told me that I wasn't on the list to receive a compression pay increase (I've worked here for over 16 years, have been an Admin III for the past three, and with the raise in UCA minimum salary am now paid the same amount as an Admin II who's worked here for two years), and suggested I reach out to Amy Whitehead. I sent Amy an email yesterday to ask for more information about how to get on that list; is it compiled based on years of service, job title, yearly evaluation, etc.? I haven't received a response from her yet, but I wanted to make y'all aware that this happened. Thank you all for your service. =)"

- 1. Response from Staff Senate President Whit Ables: Thank you so much for reaching out to us. Regarding your question, yes, we were aware of the salary compression adjustment for some employees. President Davis mentioned some salary compression adjustments happening in his end of the fiscal year email to campus, although specific information was dispersed to individuals who were part of this adjustment by HR. Amy Whitehead and HR should be able to answer your specific questions about the criteria for the salary adjustment. As for more information, UCA is currently conducting a salary study through an outside entity, and we have a salary review committee involved with that. This study will focus on many criteria with compression and years of service certainly being a part of the discussion as part of that. While this does not guarantee a salary adjustment, we wanted to let you know that this issue is on our minds as we continue our work with the salary review committee. Thank you so much!
- **B.** Constituent Concern: "I am new to the Staff Senate and not sure if this is the proper way to inform everyone about this concern. I work in the Finance and Administration Department in McCastlain Hall in the basement. We have a water fountain right outside our offices. However, no one is able to or will use it due to the dark green water that comes out of it. We asked for maintenance/Conway Corp to take a look at it for us. But we were told that it is just from the pipes and if we hold down the button and let the water run it will clear up. Most of the workers down here carry refillable water bottles/cups everyday and we have to go to Wingo or the student center to refill our bottles. We simply do not trust drinking from any of the fountains in our building due to this dark green water. I was asked to bring this to the attention of the Staff Senate and hope we can get some kind of a resolution."

Types of anonymous reports may include but are not limited to; hazing, uncharacteristic or extreme aggression towards others, suicide ideation, or major life events (family deaths, change in financial status, or less of a relationship). If you are not sure if your submission qualifies for 313-TALKUCA, submit your report anyway. The Dean of Students Office will make a determination about next steps for your report.
