X. Good and Welfare

- **A.** Senator Calvery- we have a staff coordinator position open in the library posted currently. Get your applications in quick if you're interested because it won't be up too long.
- **B.** Senator Vangsnes- progress reports are open, so if you're in any of those positions on campus that reaches out to our students, uh, please be sure to talk to them. If you are faculty, if you teach class, make sure you get those in. They will close on the 17th. Outreach to these students is key at this point, especially for class attendance and grades. Get them to the resources they, they need.
- C. Senator Hammond- we have hired our new Student Wellness person, Virgie Jackson. He started last week and he's getting acclimated to the campus. Ary is retiring on the 28th of February, and her position will be posted very shortly.
- D. Senator Taylor- we have women's basketball at home tonight; they're on a roll, so you should come and watch. Men's basketball at home tomorrow and then women's basketball is back at home on Saturday. So tonight we are doing, the academic recognition for our female sports. I need some volunteers and I prefer people that are familiar with websites, but they don't know anything about accessibility. Somebody that's familiar with social media but doesn't know about accessibility. And somebody that doesn't know anything about computers to take

our Vector solutions training and let us know how long it took them, what we need to change and what is not clear before we launch this on the campus.
