 - 1. The Angel Bear class for 2025 has significantly increased, so we've adjusted the timeline to accommodate for the influx of applications.
 - 2. Angels will be available for adoption beginning November 5th. Tree locations include Ronnie Williams Student Center, Torreyson Library, Thomas C. Courtway Recreation Center, and Wingo Hall.
 - 3. In 2024 we served 40 UCA families totaling 83 angels. This year we will serve 62 UCA families totaling 135 angels, an increase of almost 63%.

VII. Constituent Concerns/Communication

- A. Constituent Concern: "I am writing to respectfully request that the Staff Senate consider advocating for priority registration for UCA staff who are enrolled in courses under the university's tuition remission program. Providing staff with the opportunity to register early would not only enhance the value of the tuition remission benefit, but also offer meaningful support to departments across campus. With early access to course registration, staff members would be better able to select classes that align with both their educational goals and their work responsibilities. This balance is essential in ensuring continued productivity within departments while also promoting the professional development of employees. By allowing staff to plan their class schedules around departmental needs, we can minimize disruptions and better maintain operational efficiency. Furthermore, this adjustment would reflect UCA's continued commitment to fostering a culture of learning and development among its employees. Thank you for your time and consideration. I would be happy to discuss this request further or provide any additional information that may be helpful."
 - 1. Outreach from President Fricks: "Thank you for reaching out and for thoughtfully sharing your perspective on staff priority registration. The Staff Senate truly values ideas that promote professional development and strengthen the experience of UCA employees who are also pursuing their educational goals. After reviewing your request, we confirmed that registration access for all students —

including staff enrolled through the tuition remission program — follows the university's established registration schedule. Registration windows are assigned based on a variety of factors such as student classification, special programs, and other designated groups. These timeframes are designed to ensure an equitable and consistent process for all members of the campus community. While staff are not eligible for early or priority registration, we understand the uniqueness of balancing coursework and departmental responsibilities. We encourage staff to plan accordingly using the published registration timeline, available here: Spring 2026 Registration Schedule. Please know that the Staff Senate appreciates your advocacy and commitment to continued learning. We remain dedicated to elevating staff voices and exploring opportunities that enhance professional development and work-life balance. Thank you again for engaging with us in this important conversation."

- B. Constituent Concern: "I have had a constituent express concern over rumors that UCA is no longer recycling items placed in green bags, and that they have not seen green recycling bags in dedicated recycling receptacles. They didn't give a specific example, but were concerned that there was no longer a reliable way to recycle on campus. Would it be possible to reach out to physical plant for a response?"
 - 1. Outreach from President Fricks: "Thank you for sharing this constituent concern. I've reached out to Kevin Carter, Associate Vice President for Facilities to get some insight on this concern. I will update you with a response."
 - 2. Response from Kevin Carter "Thanks for reaching out! For recycling, everything in the recycling bins is still going to the recycling center. We have a large open-top dumpster next to the trash compactor, and our staff sorts it when they get it to the back of the Physical Plant. Let me know if you have any other questions!"
 - 3. Senator Turner- There is a Sustainability Committee through Student Government. As they look into the recycling efforts on campus, I will share any information they have with Staff Senate.
