#### **Out-of-State Waivers**

Students residing in University housing may qualify for the out-of-state tuition scholarship by admission with the following minimum GPA:

- i. Entering freshmen must have a minimum 2.5 high school GPA (on a 4.00 scale)
- ii. Undergraduate transfer students must have a minimum 2.0 GPA (on a 4.00 scale) on prior undergraduate coursework
- iii. Graduate students must have a minimum 2.7 undergraduate GPA (on a 4.00 scale), a 3.0 undergraduate GPA in the last 60 credit hours, or a 3.0 graduate GPA on any coursework taken at another institution Students not meeting the above may qualify based upon a successful admissions appeal or admission pursuant to other University requirements.

Full-time students receiving a full tuition scholarship provided by unrestricted funds of the University (State Statue 6-82-103); For questions, please contact the department awarding the scholarship.

UCA graduates who are dues paying members of the UCA Alumni Association.
