- \* Attend and successfully complete your classes, <u>including</u> the UCAN Seminar, a one hour non-credit seminar.
- \* Limit your enrollment hours.
- \* Complete weekly **mandatory** study hours in the library.

Appointments for the fall program will begin June 10th. On your appointment day, <u>be on time and sign in at the front desk of the Advising Center in Harrin</u> <u>Hall. Bring your completed</u> application and the UCAN contract with you to your appointment!

You will <u>not</u> be able to make changes to your schedule or meet with your advisor for registration until you have met with Mr. Williams and been <u>accepted</u> into the UCAN program.
