

REVISED (7/8/2013) FLOWCHART FOR MINORS IN SPANISH

A minor in Spanish requires the following a minimum of 18 hours at the 2310 level or above.

1. These 18 hours must include
 - * Spanish 2310, 2320, and 3300
 - * Three hours of culture/civilization or literature (Spanish 3312, 3313, 3315, 3320, 3321, 4395, or 4396)
 - * Two courses chosen from among the following: 2325, 2330, 2350, 3303, 3312, 3313, 3315, 3320, 3321, 3160, 3260, 3330, 3340, 3360, 3370, 3390, 3398, 4350, 4395, 4396, 4397
 2. Satisfactory performance on proficiency tests upon entrance to and exit from the program.
 3. A minimum grade of C in each course applying to the major program.
- Summer or a semester of study in a Spanish-speaking country is strongly encouraged but not required.

Spanish minor course sequence

- Students who start at 2310 or lower **MUST TAKE THESE COURSES IN SEQUENCE**, one semester at a time:

1) Spanish 2310 Intermediate Spanish II	—————	2) Spanish 2320 Intermediate Spanish III	—————	3) Spanish 3300* Advanced Gram. & Comp. I

** note: in exceptional cases, by permission of the instructor or the chair, a student may begin to take another 3000-level course concurrently with 3300.*

AND ONE course from the following categories (3 credits total):

CIVILIZATION

- Spanish 3312 (Peninsular Civilization)
- Spanish 3315 (Hispanic Studies)
- Spanish 3313 (Latin American Civilization)

Any 4000-level class should be taken after completion of Spanish 3303:

- Spanish 4396 (Adv. Themes in Hispanic Studies)

LITERATURE

- Spanish 3320 (Peninsular Literature)
- Spanish 3315 (Hispanic Studies)
- Spanish 3321 (Hispanic Literature)

- Spanish 4395 (Adv. Themes in Hispanic Lit.)

MINORS IN SPANISH MUST SELECT 6 HOURS FROM AMONG THESE ELECTIVES:

The 4000-level classes should be taken after completion of 3000-level courses:

- Spanish 3303 Advanced composition and textual analysis;
- Spanish 2325, 2350, 3312, 3313, 3315, 3320 or 3321, 3360, 3370, 4350, 4395, 4396, 4397;
- *Practicum* courses (3160/3260);
- *Internship* course (3390);
- Certain *study abroad* courses in Mexico or Spain (3340, 3398 etc.), with approval of chair and advisor;
- *Business Spanish* (2330 and 3330)

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Spanish 1310, 1320 and 2300 may not be used as credit toward completion of the major or minor.
- Most WLAN Courses (1300, 1310, 2315, 2325, 4315, 4325, 4330) do NOT count towards a major or minor in Spanish, nor does Spanish for Professionals (4360). WLAN 2350, however, DOES count toward the *major*.
- In order to graduate, every UCA student must have a total of 120 semester hours and 40 upper-division hours; 24 of the last 30 hours must be completed in residence.
