Students,

Today brought the first day of our transition to 100% online instruction as we adjust to the realities of COVID-19 and work to complete the last four weeks of our spring semester. I wanted to send you a note to let you know how much I appreciate your understanding and commitment to finish the semester strong despite these unforeseen and difficult circumstances. I also want you to know that I am disappointed that we are not able to carry out the semester as originally planned.

Our campus is disheartened to have our more personal relationships with you truncated so abruptly. Our faculty and staff are diligently working to make these last four weeks special, but do not think for a second that we are not all going to miss you terribly. Jenny and I were talking the other night about the quality of the students in our respective classes this spring. Our students have challenged us with enthusiasm, curiosity, and initiative. We are both going to harness as much of that energy as possible as we move our courses online ... but we still will miss key parts of the great relationships formed.

We are also sad that impactful occasions like The Big Event and other special student events had to be cancelled or postponed.
